






























For past 20 years, federal spending has grown 63% faster than inflation In 2012, 31 cents of every dollar Washington spent was borrowed resulting in a \$1.1 trillion deficit The national debt now exceeds \$18 trillion and exceeds 100 percent of the U.S. GDP Health care spending is the largest and fastest-growing program in the entire federal budget In 2015 health care spending became the largest item in the federal budget














President Obama on healthcare
